



FARHAD MOSHIRI Born in Shiraz, Iran, in 1963,

Moshiri in March 2008 became the first living Middle Eastern artist with a Contemporary work auctioned for more than \$1 million. His "Eshgh" ("Love," 2007) was a black canvas with the Persian word for love embroidered on it. Since then, the artist, whose works are a mix of Western and Eastern Pop art and kitsch, has gone from strength to strength. Last year, he got his first solo museum exhibition at the Andy Warhol Museum in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania. He is represented by Perrotin Gallery in Paris and by Thaddeus Ropac in Salzburg (Austria), which gave him a show in 2018.
